followed the required Discuss ion Board Guidelines. I have no plans to change the format or content of the questions in the future. A few of the students failed to respond to three other student. The outcome of their score was lower as this requirement is one of the main components of the assignment. The majority of the students completed the quizzes, exams and discussion board assignments in a timely manner. In the past, the students reported that they liked the structure of the course , the textbook, the instructor and the content. However, the essays were lengthy to grade, and somewhat cumbersome due to the excessive number of questions. After fine-tuning the essay questions from spring of 201 8, I feel that the assessments effectively measure the course outcomes. I believe the students are immersing themselves in the content rather than memorizing facts that will soon be forgotten just to complete a timed test. Based on the scores, all outcomes were met.
