Gentlemen:

We have an application for old age security from an Indian resident of this County, William P. Morehouse.

This person has been accepted by the Social Security Board as being over the age of 65 years and has been drawing a limited amount of social security since February 1941. Apparently the Social Security Board decided that his date of birth was August 28, 1874. Since receiving the application for old age security we have checked with the Carson Indian Agency and their census roll of January 1, 1940, listed Mr. Morehouse as being 60 years of age. We have no doubt but that the Social Security Board based their findings on competent evidence but as we understand the State Department of Social Welfare they desire that we clear the age of Indians from your rolls.

In talking with Mr. Harry W. Gilmore, Welfare Division of the Carson Indian Agency, he suggested that we write to you and have you furnish us with the census record of this Indian from your office. It was also his suggestion that you might be able to reconcile your records with those on file with the Social Security Board as it would appear to us they had satisfactory evidence of Mr. Morehouse being over 65 otherwise he would not be receiving old age and survivors insurance payments.

We would be pleased to have this information at your earliest convenience.
