We are in receipt of a letter from Mr. Irons requesting certificates as to the age of Susie Jim of Bridgeport, Mary Ann Brassanovitch of Bridgeport, Minnie Dick and Henry Rube of Coleville.

In accordance with his request there are attached hereto certificates for all except Susie Jim. We do not find her under that name on the final roll of California Indians.

We are also attaching Mr. Irons' letter. Attention is particularly called to the second paragraph regarding Alpine Dick and Queen Dick. In the counties under this jurisdiction, we have been able to have the County Welfare Boards agree that they would assume full responsibility for those who were entitled to old age security thus releasing our funds that we have available for those people who are not entitled to old age security.

Will you please let me know as soon as possible just what Alvine Dick and Queen Dick, both of Benton, receive as ward Indians. They have made application for Old Age Security and as I understand the law, they are entitled to it but whatever they receive as ward Indians must be deducted as income.
