
Dear Mr. Nash:

When our roll of California Indians was compiled in
1929, Nattie August was shown as a widow, therefore, we have
no knowledge as to the status of her husband. She is shown as
having Final Roll No. 844; Application No. 4953; Date of Birth,
August 15, 1871; Degree of Blood, $1/4$; Tribe, Plate. Her children
are listed as follows:

George August,	son	born August 13, 1906
Helen August,	Daughter	October 15, 1915
Earlina August,	Daughter	September 12, 1917
Inez August,	Daughter	July 5, 1924

There may be other children who had established homes
of their own and so enrolled as heads of their own families. We
do not have family records for Mono County. Carson Agency may be
able to give you further information.

Reference is made to your letter of August 15, 1937, addressed to Mr. Irons, regarding the age of Bessie Sam. We have located a Bessie Sam on the Final Roll of California Indians, whose address is given as Colville, Mono County, California. She has Final Roll No. 23190; Application No. 10720; the date of birth is given as 1875. She is shown as the mother of Mabel Evaline Sam, born in 1915. However, her name appears on the Supplemental Roll. The names on the Supplemental Roll were taken from the existing census rolls of the various agencies. Therefore, there is no proof as to actual age in this case, as there are on those names that were placed on the main roll.
