Dear Mr. Irons:

Mr. Hooper has sent us certificates of age for Mary Ann Brazzandovitch, Minnie Dick, and Henry Sube, which you requested, but unfortunately neglected to sign them, and so we are returning them to him for that, asking that he return them direct to you when signed. He says that he is unable to find the name of Susie Jim on the final roll of California Indians. It may be that she is enrolled under some other name, and if you can secure any information to that effect we will ask him to search the rolls again.

Mr. Hooper also sent us a copy of your letter asking about relief given Alpine and Susan Dick as ward Indians. Mr. Hooper states that in the counties under Sacramento jurisdiction the counties have agreed to assume full responsibility for all those who were entitled to old age security, thus releasing the Indian Service funds for those not entitled to old age security. As you may know, the Indian Service has no specific relief funds, and all relief that is given comes from general support funds and is extremely inadequate. Mr. Hooper, of course, can give you no information about these two Indians, as Mono County is in Carson jurisdiction and not under Sacramento. Our funds permit of food relief only. As a matter of fact, however, we do not believe that these Indians are really entitled to relief from the Indian Service, and we were expecting to go into the matter soon to have them transferred to the proper source of relief. We do not know who placed them on the Indian Service relief roll, as it was done before that region was transferred to this jurisdiction, but they do not live on any reservation and have no lands allotted to them, and so are not wards of the government. Strictly speaking, they are county and not Indian Service responsibilities. There are no ward Indians in Mono County, so far as we know.
