Dear Miss Barieau,

Thank you very much for the information concerning Betty Saulque of Benton. We shall see to it that she gets medical attention. Your description of her condition brings to mind the appearance of John Saulque whom we recently diagnosed as a mercury poisoning.

On our enclosed schedule for November you will note that we shall be in Benton Monday, November 10th. Since there appears to be more work there than I anticipated we shall plan to do the school examinations and immunizations at that time. I trust that this will be satisfactory with Mrs. Hage and your own program.

We shall do the physical examinations and immunizations at the Oasis school Thursday, October 30th. Since you have asked us to do patch tuberculin testing, we shall do it at that time. If the Westgard Pass is open the following Wednesday we will go over and read these for you at that time. If it is impossible to reach Oasis, I shall instruct the teacher as to the reactions and she should be able to read them for us. Certainly any obviously positive ones will be evident.

Perhaps you will be able to be in Leevining and Mono Lake Monday, October 27th when we do the Physical Examination on the Indian Children there. If so we shall discuss any problems which you may have in Mono County with which I may be able to help you. Thanks again for your letter, and feel free to call on us at any time.
