lot 2) Sec. 6, T. 27 N., R. 58 E., M. D. M., under the General
Allotment Act.

I certify that I am personally acquainted with the
applicant, know him to be a Shoshone Indian who has never had
land allotted to him on the public domain and that he has never
lived upon any reservation, that he is known, generally, as an
Indian and a member of the above tribe, throughout the country
where he lives. I am not able to give the names of his parents
and grand-parents, but know they have never made their homes upon
any reservation and have never had land allotted to them.


These Indians might have been entitled to take up their
