commissioners and the western bands
of the shoshoni nation of Inds
represented by my grand father chief
old Timock and principal men and
warriors. as follows. I wont state any
thing about at present. By them as I
follows on the with by wrong-go-ga
mountain and shoshoni river call
on the west by Su-non-te-yah-moni

on Smith Creek mountains on South to
 Wi-co-bah and the Colorado Desert, over
 East by Pe-ro-no-be Valley or Steptoe Valley
 and Great Salt Lake Valley. But after
 I did heard Grandfather did have
 Sand pattern for his land. After grand
 father was died. I did know about
 his land pattern since that now
 But I was only ten year of age. Grand
 father was died. Therefore I was not
 realized about his land pattern after
 he was died. But I am still here on
 my grand father use to be place.
 I did cultivated about fourthy acres of
 land for my own. I did heard about
 the white people will run us out of
 my ranch. Certain they did claimed
 I got no water for my ranch or for
 my own use. But certain do claim
 all my water for them self today. I did
 heard all about Mr. S. L. Wines pump

in my land that is after Grand father
 was died. I might to say of from me
 Wines. Claimed all my land what's
 the George Washington gave to me
 years 1863. And also all of my water. How
 would you think of if you was in my
 place? Accound of land and water ma
 I was mistake and I suppose America
 various indian are land possessor mig
 say. But today I am working for white m
 in Valley account of this matter. I am
 afraid about the white people today and
 I cannot getting along with them at
 present. Every little thing happen w
 I and whites people. we getting trouble over
 it. But certainley I do not like getting
 trouble with white people, any more than
 I can helped. During they harvest time
 I earned just sufficiency to buy my grub
 with during through the winter and all
 hay. grain for my horses.

I should think we will starve to death some these days. According this why makes me brake over chopped forest for my fire wood use. The Elks Lawyer made such Rule as for Land and also water. This is against the rule and I afraid account of this if I do not why put me in Country jail for it. Near all the white people states is the George Washington Rule, that is American Law Indian cannot hold the Land or mine Claim. But nearly all my Tribes were going died. We are very few left what's left in Ruby Valley worry about our Land matter. I want you your government Land Survey immediate please. I you realized your Ancestor stated before you discovered in the United States of American you was said friend-ship had very good Land, forest, Mineral Rock, good presence of gold and also Grazing land upon it. I suppose my money

I should think we will starve to death
some these days. According this why makes
me broke.

Certainly I do heard about Ft Halleck or
old camp Halleck mil. Res. Some principal
men given to Soldier Charley also Soldier
Jim. I suppose some of their family are still
living along the line that is at Wells, or
Deeth or Star Valley. The didnt know
about their land I suppose. I wished
you would please. Can you sent me y.
land surveyor immediately please. These
land surveying so much. I will report
to you still more later.

Ruby Valley, Nevada.

Sir:

The Office has received your letter of April 10, 1912, in which you say, among other things, that you have cultivated forty acres of land, but owing to some trouble which is not quite clear to the Office, you would like to have a Government surveyor sent immediately.

To enable the Office to give intelligent consideration to your request it will be necessary for you to be more explicit regarding your claims by giving the location and description of the land, as well as the number of your allotment application. Upon receipt of this information the Office can advise you regarding your rights. It is not thought that it will be necessary for you to incur the expense of coming to Washington to adjust the matters you have in mind.
