Dear Sir:-

I have your letter of yesterday but I am unable to understand just what you want. Is there some particular piece of land that you want to apply for? If so and you can get the description of it I will be glad to assist you in getting the application properly filed whether it is in the Forest reserve or not, providing, of course, that it is public land.

I have explained to you and to others that you have the right to file on such land any where it may be found and where water can be secured to make it of any value to you.

You can not get, and I can not get for you land that belongs to some one else except by purchase and the same applies to water rights.

As to assisting the Ruby Valley Indians I am anxious to do whatever I can for them but can not be there all the time nor much of the time as I have a big territory and am busy at other places much of the time.

As to the treaty you mention, it will not get for you land that has been patented to some one else.

I have hoped to get over there again before Winter and may be able to come next month though I do not promise definitely.

The best thing that can be done for those Indians in the Valley is for them to get busy and put water on the land that they already have.


Dear Sir:

In acknowledging receipt of your letter of March 17, I have to advise you that Mr. Asbury is at present away from the office but upon his return I will call his attention to your letter.

I would also like further information with regard to the mining claims which you state some Indian had lost through fraud.

I will state that it is the intention of Mr. Asbury to assist you and other Indians in securing land in this State as rapidly as possible.

Dear Sir:-

Your letter of May 28<sup>th</sup>, 1913, to the Land Office at Carson City, was referred to me for reply.

You inquire about Sec. 24, in Township 39 N., Range 61 East. I find that all of the land in that locality adjacent to railroad land was taken up by the Pacific Reclamation Co. of Salt Lake City, and all of Sec. 24 appears to belong to that company. Dave HARRICK has the NW<sup>1/4</sup> of Sec. 24, in Township 39, N., Range 62 East, which is just six miles east from the land mentioned in your letter. He first filed on some land in Sec. 28, nearly a mile northwest from his present land. HARRICK's land was taken up under the Indian Allotment Act, and is held in trust by the government, so that he cannot sell it for a number of years.

Dear Sir:-

Replying to your letter of the 11th of May in reference to some land near Skelton I have looked over the records in the Land Office, and find that there is considerable land along Huntington Creek that is taken up as state land and some water filings have been made but as that water forms a part of the Humboldt river the applications have been suspended awaiting the settlement of the water question along that river.

Your state map as to the location of the land was so indefinite that it is impossible for me to say whether the land you have in mind is vacant or not but most of the land along the creeks in that locality has been taken up for many years and it is very doubtful if there is any that is of any value for which water could be secured.

You said about three miles from Skelton but you did not say in which direction but I found a Huntington creek about three miles west which must be the place to which you refer.
