Dear Mr. Jenkins:-

Your letter of January 22 addressed to the Forest Supervisor at Currant, Nevada has been forwarded to this office since there are no Forest Service, Supervisor's headquarters located at Currant.

I have a deep personal interest in Indian affairs and I wish to assure you that I will do all in my power, consistent with my other duties to cooperate with your department and the Indians in this vicinity in the management of their affairs.

I am advised by Forest Ranger C. R. Townsend of Currant, Nevada that One Arm Bob is now on his ranch at Cottonwood Creek and that the Ranger has forwarded your letter addressed to the Indian to him at Sharp, Nevada. The Ranger's contention, that One Arm Bob is on his ranch, is supported by the fact that the Ranger had recently received a letter from him and that the Ranger in reply had sent the Indian some old clothes.

You may rest assured that we will do all in our power

to cooperate with you and One Arm Bob in the proper disposition of the use of his lands in the future.
