Additional Information

While we do not want to discourage you from attending Great Basin College, it is important for you to be aware of how unique GBC and Elko, Nevada are.

1. We have no financial aid/scholarships for international students. Please be prepared to pay for all your expenses.
2. F-1 students are not eligible to work off campus, and there are almost no opportunities for you to work on our campus because the vast majority of funding for student workers is from the federal government, which requires that you be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident.
3. Elko is a small town (population under 20,000), 240 miles (385 km) from the nearest major city/airport: Salt Lake City. Elko does have a small airport and you can fly in and out on a small commuter plane. There are taxis available, but no public transportation within Elko. Elko is 5,000 feet (1524 meters) high. Winters can be extremely cold, with an average high in January of 36° F (2° C), low of 14° F (-10° degree C).
4. Due to the requirement that F-1 students be enrolled in a minimum of 9 “live” credits (as opposed to internet), many of our degrees are not available to F-1 students because they are primarily offered online. Our International Student Application has the current list of degrees available for international students, but this changes frequently as more of our courses are offered online. No matter what your major, it is highly likely that some of your required courses will be internet-based.
5. The number of international students each semester ranges from 1 to 6, so be aware that we do not have a full-time international advisor or the international student events that you would find at a larger institution.
