VI. Approval of Minutes For Possible Action

- A. Senator Green moved to approve the minutes for November 10th, 2016. Senator Pfarr seconded. VII. President's Report Information Only

- A. President Augustina Fernandez discussed current SGA events and her current activities as SGA President.
- She said it was busy week for herself and the Elko senators and it was decided to not do the Turkey Hunt Event as planned.
 - SOLAR was on Tuesday, November 15th. Director of Environmental Health, Safety, and Security, Pat Anderson, was able to help retrieve food from Port of Subs. Senators Green and Pfarr attended the meeting. There was little representation for clubs; Phi Beta Lambda; AIGA; SKILLS USA. She said that there is lack of communication between clubs, so there was a discussion at the meeting on how to better improve the communication. AIGA is looking into doing a float at the Snowflake Festival, they want to advertise and ask for other club participation. Michael Bail, the advisor for AIGA, said that they are willing to help make T-Shirts because they get a discounted price on some website. George Kleeb, advisor for PBL, said they are no longer doing Toastmasters because they are not getting the participants to keep the event going. They are also struggling with keeping members for the club, they plan to move the meetings to more of an online base, they hope it will work with their schedules. Skills USA will be doing a BBQ a week before finals week, and also have games going on that will be run by the different clubs within Skills.
 - She mentioned that there was Shoshone Language Teachers Workshop going on at the Elko campus. It is a workshop that helps elders or teachers to get a basic structure on how to teach the Shoshone language. She was attending it that day, and it would continue on to the following day.
 - She said she attended a meeting with a committee to discuss the applicants for the Board of Regents Scholarship. She mentioned that all three applicants are outstanding that it will be a tough decision. The Scholarship is \$5000.


