#### **INFORMATION**

Vice President Stamp provided a link to the SGA logo designs created by the graphic designer and shared which two designs were the preferred ones per the officers' vote. He will email the officers in regard to color options.

### **7. STUDENT ADVOCATE'S REPORT**

#### **INFORMATION**

Student Advocate Garcia mentioned the following:

- Officers must complete the surveys sent out via email in order for grade checks to be performed and scholarships to be posted. Currently, four surveys are missing.
- Two SGA meetings have been scheduled over the summer: June 18<sup>th</sup> and July 9<sup>th</sup>. Attendance is mandatory.
- Student emails will be deactivated over the summer so all SGA communication will occur through personal emails.
- She will be out of office from May 19<sup>th</sup>-24<sup>th</sup>.
- The SGA awards have arrived and will be mailed soon.

**8. WINNEMUCCA BUILDING PROJECT UPDATE**

**INFORMATION**

VP Sibert introduced the update on the Winnemucca Building Project. The groundbreaking ceremony took place on May 7<sup>th</sup>. Good progress is being made. She turned the update over to Alyssa Mickelson and Danielle Fabri, representatives from VanWoertBigott.

Alyssa Mickelson discussed plans for the interior design of the building and shared drawn images of the finished design. Primary furnishings include: benches and other forms of seating, tables, study areas, and a vending machine.

VP Sibert concluded the update by inviting officers to email any questions to herself or Student Advocate Garcia to be passed on to VWB for their review. The grand opening for the building will be in summer 2022.

**9. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF FY2022 GBC SGA BUDGET**

**FOR POSSIBLE ACTION**

VP Sibert drafted a budget based on what SGA has spent thus far, what funds are left over, and what revenues are anticipated to be received for the next fiscal year.

She mentioned the following:

- The fee increase is 2.8% for lower and upper registration fees for FY2022. Since the wages (scholarships) that SGA officers receive are based upon the rate of the registration fees, they also have increased slightly.
- The miscellaneous wages item on the budget is for the payments that occur over the summer for SGA meeting attendance.
- The operating accounts for the centers (Battle Mountain, Ely, Pahrump, and Winnemucca) have been left the same.
- The NSA account still has \$6,200, so VP Sibert does not recommend any additional transfer of funds into the account for FY2022.
- It is planned that there will be an in-person graduation ceremony/celebration for FY2022, so \$10,000 has been accounted for as SGA's financial assistance for the event.
- The budget allocates money for student activities as facilitated by both SGA and other student organizations.
- VP Sibert anticipates a carry-forward balance of about \$55,000 to be used by all centers in FY2022. The estimated revenue of \$70,000 takes into account the fee increase and enrollment increase. She estimates a carry-forward balance of \$26,000 from FY2022 into FY2023.

Vice President Stamp motioned for approval of the FY2022 GBC SGA Budget. Senator Sanchez seconded.

DISCUSSION: Motion passes unanimously.

**10. LEADERSHIP TRAINING ACTIVITY**

Student Advocate Garcia had officers reflect on their time in SGA and then asked the following questions:

- 1) What did you do as a GBC SGA officer that was the most impactful for the GBC body?
- 2) What did you learn as a leader that was the most impactful to you, and how will you use what you have learned in real life?

Everyone in attendance took turns answering.
