5. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

INFORMATION

Student Advocate Garcia presented a resignation letter from President Dempsey and announced that Vice President Stamp will become Interim President until elections conclude. She reminded everyone to thank President Dempsey for her service.

6. VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

INFORMATION

Interim President Stamp submitted an agenda request for the bi-yearly Open Mic Night event. He also attended Board of Regents meetings earlier in the day. Among other topics, Covid guidelines and restrictions for colleges was discussed. The vaccination rate in Nevada is currently at 25%.

7. STUDENT ADVOCATE'S REPORT

Student Advocate Garcia thanked Interim President Stamp for stepping into the position and for attending the Board of Regents meetings, which happen quarterly. She also mentioned the following:

- There have been 22 applications for fall elections. She has reached out to these applicants. Some have not responded. However, others have responded and have also started attending the SGA meetings.

- On Sept. 28 from 11:30 to 12:30 PST, there will be a discussion event for students titled "Talking Covid" with Dr. Trudy Larson. SGA officers will be sent a calendar invite.

8. ARGENTUM UPDATE

INFORMATION

Chelsey Pennell, the student editor for *Argentum*, presented an update on the 2021-2022 issue. The theme is “mosaic”. She asked for help creating a stronger presence on campus to promote student participation and publication. She shared the *Argentum* website with everyone and discussed what forms of submission are accepted: writing, art, multimedia. First place prize is \$250; second place is \$100; and third place is \$50.

She asked if the submission information could be sent to students via text. Student Advocate Garcia directed Ms. Pennell to the Communications office to help her market *Argentum*.

Interim President Stamp asked how the multimedia submissions will be displayed. Ms. Pennell said that links will be provided in both the hard and online copies.

Secretary Stadlander asked when the submission deadline will be. It is Feb. 15th, 2021.

DISCUSSION: Motion passes unanimously.


